100 Street Corridor Construction Bulletin

Beneath 100 Street, the 80-year-old water, sanitary, and storm sewer pipes need replacement. On the surface, the entire roadway and sidewalks will be reconstructed to reflect a high-quality urban design to match the vision created during the 100 Street Corridor Plan Design Charrette that took place in 2019.

You will see features such as:

- Wider sidewalks to accommodate pedestrians and winter snow management
- Boulevard trees with an automated irrigation system
- New benches and furnishings
- Decorative lighting which improves visibility, but also helps create a safer street
- Left-hand turn lanes to make vehicle movements easier
- Dedicated space for roadway snow storage

EXCAVATION ACTIVITIES FOR UTILITIES INSTALLATIONS

Week of May 13, 2021 Update

Since the construction began on May 6, 2021, the following activities have occurred:

- Installation of temporary site fencing for pedestrian safety
- Installation of detour and business support signage
- Installation of two gate valves for improved isolation abilities on existing water mains
- Excavation activities for utility installation
- Installation of new water main between 96 and 97 avenues

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Continued excavation activities for utility installation
- Installation of new water main between 97 and 98a avenues
- Fire hydrant installation between 96 and 97 avenues
- Installation of an additional gate valve for improved isolation abilities on existing water mains
