100 Street Corridor Construction Bulletin

Beneath 100 Street, the 80-year-old water, sanitary, and storm sewer pipes need replacement. On the surface, the entire roadway and sidewalks will be reconstructed to reflect a high-quality urban design to match the vision created during the 100 Street Corridor Plan Design Charrette that took place in 2019.

You will see features such as:

- Wider sidewalks to accommodate pedestrians and winter snow management
- Boulevard trees with an automated irrigation system
- New benches and furnishings
- Decorative lighting which improves visibility, but also helps create a safer street
- Left-hand turn lanes to make vehicle movements easier
- Dedicated space for roadway snow storage

Since the previous update on June 6, 2022, the following activities have occurred:

- Completed utility service connection to properties
- Silva-cell excavation and installation
- Electrical duct installation
- Screw pile installation for street lights and traffic signals
- Sub-base preparation

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Paving 99 Avenue intersection to prepare for opening on Sunday, June 26
- Continued electrical duct and junction box installation
- Continued silva-cell excavation and installation
- 101 Avenue intersection closure and excavation
- Sidewalk closure
- Preparations for curb and sidewalk installation
