## 100 Street Corridor Construction Bulletin

Beneath 100 Street, the 80-year-old water, sanitary, and storm sewer pipes need replacement. On the surface, the entire roadway and sidewalks will be reconstructed to reflect a high-quality urban design to match the vision created during the 100 Street Corridor Plan Design Charrette that took place in 2019.

You will see features such as:

- Wider sidewalks to accommodate pedestrians and winter snow management
- Boulevard trees with an automated irrigation system
- New benches and furnishings
- Decorative lighting which improves visibility, but also helps create a safer street
- Left-hand turn lanes to make vehicle movements easier
- Dedicated space for roadway snow storage

### Week of July 15, 2021 Update

Since the previous update on June 24, 2021, the following activities have occurred:

- Installation of Silva Cells for street trees complete
- Screw pile installations complete
- Underground utilities (water, storm sewer and sanitary sewer) installation and tie-ins complete
- Road subbase placement complete
- Concrete curb and gutter and centre lane pouring between 96 and 97 avenues

### Work planned for the reporting next period

- Concrete curb and gutter and centre lane pouring between 97 and 99 avenues
- Electrical ducting and irrigation system installations
- East sidewalk preparation and concrete
- Landscaping on the east side of the project
- Move pedestrians to east sidewalk and close west sidewalk for continued work
