Kin Park

Kin Park is one of the communities largest destinations parks, and after extensive community input, we are upgrading it with new play equipment, multi-use and boarded outdoor rinks, and much more. Phase one of this multi-year project will see work on the west side of the park.

Week of July 15, 2021 Update

Since the June 24, 2021 update, the following activities have occurred:

- Continued material clearing and excavation
- Began multi-use trail preparation
- Began installation of underground utilities
- Subbase placement for boarded and multi-purpose rinks

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Continued installation of underground utilities
- Continued multi-use trail preparation
- Begin preparing for activity pods
- Demolition of the existing clubhouse building
- Preparations for parking lot and begin required excavation and subbase placement

81 Street

81 Street between 100 and 101 avenues is being upgraded to a paved road complete with new underground utilities and street lighting.

Week of July 15, 2021 Update

Since the June 24, 2021 update, the following activities have occurred:

- Exacavation and installation of water main beginning at 101 Avenue and working south
- Installation of fire hydrant to improve fire response capabilities

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Continued water main installation
- Testing of water main following installation
- Begin installation of storm sewer main

112 Avenue

112 Avenue between 104 and 106 streets will be reconstructed with new underground utilities, sidewalks, and street lighting. The project also includes trail upgrades between 111 and 112 avenues, upgrades to 104 Street north of 111 Avenue, and upgrades to Triangle Park.

Week of July 15, 2021 Update

Since the June 24, 2021 update, the following activities have occurred:

- Site preparation and survey layouts
- Material and pavement removals

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Installation of underground utilities
- Set up overland water supply



107 Avenue Sidewalk

Installation of sidewalks and street lighting on 107 Avenue between 90 and 92 streets in front of Dr. Kearney Middle School.

Week of July 15, 2021 Update

Since the June 24, 2021 update, the following activities have occurred:

- Base and concrete preparation
- Fire hydrant installation

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Electrical installations
- Asphalt patching on 107 Avenue

96 Street

Upgrading the existing gravel road between 114a and 117 avenues to paved standards. This is the second and final phase of the project, which began in 2020. This project includes new underground utilities, road realignment, street lighting and sidewalks.

Week of July 15, 2021 Update

Since the June 24, 2021 update, the following activities have occurred:

- Site preparation and survey layouts
- Material removal and demolition of the existing outdoor rink
- Underground utilities installation
- Installation of new fire hydrant

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Continued material removal
- Continued installation of underground utilities

Watermain Looping

This project includes the installation of over 300 metres of watermain and several fire hydrants to improve fire protection, minimize service disruptions and improve the efficency of the water system.

Week of July 15, 2021 Update

Since the June 24, 2021 update, the following activities have occurred:

- Completed installation of watermain and two fire hydrants near 100 Avenue west of 86 Street
- Started installation of watermain near 104 Street and 94 Avenue.

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Tie-in water main near 100 Avenue.
- Continued installation of watermain at 104 Street and 94 Avenue.
- Start on watermain and fire hydrant installation at 99 Avenue and 104 Street.
