100 Street Corridor Construction Bulletin

Beneath 100 Street, the 80-year-old water, sanitary, and storm sewer pipes need replacement. On the surface, the entire roadway and sidewalks will be reconstructed to reflect a high-quality urban design to match the vision created during the 100 Street Corridor Plan Design Charrette that took place in 2019.

You will see features such as:

- Wider sidewalks to accommodate pedestrians and winter snow management
- Boulevard trees with an automated irrigation system
- New benches and furnishings
- Decorative lighting which improves visibility, but also helps create a safer street
- Left-hand turn lanes to make vehicle movements easier
- Dedicated space for roadway snow storage

Week of August 1, 2022 Update

Since the previous update on July 18, 2022, the following activities have occurred:

- Silva-cell excavation and installation
- Electrical and irrigation installation
- Completed underground utilities installation at 101 Avenue
- Centre turn lane, bus lane and sidewalk concrete pouring
- Sidewalk preparations on the east side of the street

Work planned for the reporting next period

- Continued silva-cell excavation and installation
- Continued sidewalk installation and preparations
- Preparations for concrete intersection at 100 Avenue
- Concrete turn lane preparations and installation to 101 Avenue
- Continued electrical and irrigation installations
- Street tree and furnishing installation
