#### Remember to:

- → Lay twigs or straw first
- → Add materials in layers, alternating between moist and dry
- → Keep your compost moist

#### In 2020, **tonnes of material** was diverted from landfills in Peace River Regional District.



You can reduce your carbon footprint and keep your neighbors safe at work by recycling right. The contents of your blue recycle cart are collected bi-weekly, and taken to Recycle-It Resource Recovery where waste workers sort, clean, and process it for use in manufacturing.

#### Remember to:

- Empty and rinse all containers
- → Remove lids

→ Flatten or crush containers and boxes

→ cups lined with paper, not plastic → pizza boxes not stained with grease

→ Place items directly in your cart, do not bag them (shredded paper goes in)
